RECYCLING



High Peak Borough Council is committed to reducing the amount of waste being sent to landfill by increasing recycling and composting. The domestic waste recycling

scheme (Binnovation) has been successful and seen a large increase in domestic waste recycling. The Council is aware that the recycling options open to commercial properties are limited at present. As part of the Council's new partnership with waste management company Veolia Environmental Services, the Council will be assessing the viability of introducing a recycling collection for commercial premises. Designated Public Places

You may have noticed new signs around Buxton and New Mills advising people that they are in a Designated Public Place. These areas have been



established under the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 which sets out powers for combating alcohol-related disorder by the way of locally approved Orders. The powers following introduction of an Order mean that the Police may require individuals to stop drinking alcohol immediately and the Police may remove alcohol from problem drinkers in the street. In addition, where individuals do not comply with such requests they could be arrested and, upon conviction, fined up to a maximum of £500.

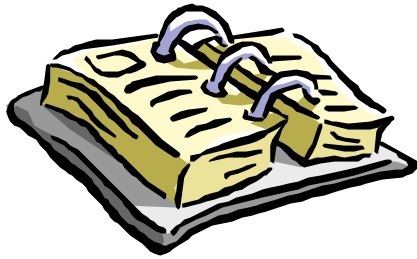

Display of Summary of Premises Licence and production of Licence upon request



During Operation Relentless the Police served several notices on designated premises supervisors who were unable to produce their premises licence or did not have the licence summary on display. An explanatory letter was sent out to all DPS's in the Borough which we hope you found useful. We hope you have checked that you have a complete copy of your licence to hand and that you are aware of all the conditions on your licence.

New B-Line cards

From September 2008, silver b_line2 cards displaying the PASS (Proof



of Age Standards Scheme) hologram and confirmation of the date of their 18th birthday on the reverse will be available from Derbyshire County Council. The new b_line2 cards with the new PASS logo offer a 'guarantee' of someone's age as well as being a student travel, discount and library card for young people in Derbyshire . PASS only applies to the new b_line2 cardholders displaying the PASS hologram in the bottom right hand corner. These can be checked by the UV detection units that have already gone out to some of you. The new cards can be used as a guarantee to traders that the cardholder is old enough to buy age-restricted goods, including, knives, solvents, alcohol, lottery tickets and fireworks.
