

AUDIT OF ACCOUNTS YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2022
NOTICE OF PUBLIC RIGHTS

The Accounts and Audit Regulations 2015
Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014
[The Accounts and Audit (Amendment) Regulations 2021]

Section 25 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014 stipulates that a local authority's accounts and supporting documentation should be made available for public inspection over thirty working days within a set period dictated by the statutory audit deadline. This would normally equate to the first ten working days of June. However the statutory audit deadlines for 2021/22 financial statements has been extended to take account of the continuing impact of COVID-19. This has meant that the publication date for draft accounts has moved from 31st May to 31st July and for the final audited accounts has moved from 31st July to 30th November 2022.

In light of the above, notice is hereby given under Regulation 15(2)(b) of the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2015 that from 1st August to 12th September between 9am and 4pm on weekdays any person may inspect, and make copies of the accounts and all books, deeds, contracts, bills, vouchers, receipts and other related documents of High Peak Borough Council for the year ended 31st March 2022, as stipulated in Section 25 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014. The accounts and other documents will be available for inspection at Buxton Town Hall, Buxton SK17 6EL by prior arrangement. Please telephone 01298 28400 to make an appointment. The draft accounts will also be available at www.highpeak.gov.uk

During this period, a local government elector for any area to which the accounts relate, or their representative, may question the auditor about the accounts, or make an objection to the accounts as set out in sections 26 and 27 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014. Any objection, and the grounds on which it is made, must be sent to the auditor in writing, with a copy to the Head of Finance, Buxton Town Hall SK17 6EL. Any objection must state the grounds on which the objection is being made and particulars of:

- i) any item of account which is alleged to be contrary to law; and
- ii) any matter in respect of which it is proposed that the auditor could make a public interest report under section 24 of, and paragraph 1 of Schedule 7 to, the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014.
